

Tiffany Haas, broadway performer: Tiffany has performed for 20 years on Broadway, National Tours, and Symphony stages. Tiffany starred as Glinda on the National Tour and in the Broadway production of Wicked. She was the Dance Captain and Associate Choreographer for the Tony Award-winning musical The Drowsy Chaperone national tour. Tiffany has appeared at City Center Encores!, Birdland, and Feinstein's/ 54 Below in New York City. She has starred in numerous regional theatre productions and with prestigious symphonies throughout the country. While receiving her BFA from the Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, she won the title of Miss Ohio and went on to compete in the Miss America Pageant. Tiffany is the Artistic Director for Destination Broadway, a Musical Theatre intensive for young aspiring performers. She travels the country teaching master classes at universities and performing arts schools. Tiffany directs the National award-winning dance team of the Academy of Dance & Gymnastics, her mother's school for nearly 45 years. Tiffany has been recognized on a national level for her choreography and has been named "Choreographer of the Year" at numerous National Dance & Performing Arts Competitions several years in a row. Tiffany's book, Waiting in the Wings: How to Launch Your Performing Career on Broadway and Beyond, is available on Amazon and Barnes and Noble.

Branch Fields, opera soloist: Described by Opera America as "a bass of resonant richness." Branch is a versatile performer engaged throughout North America and beyond in opera, musical theater, and concert. Branch made his Broadway debut in South Pacific, understudying the role of Emile de Becque, in the 2008 Lincoln Center Theater production, which won seven Tony Awards. He was Capt. Von Trapp for Charlottesville Opera, Montana TheaterWorks, and The Southwest Michigan Symphony. He was a guest soloist for the William & Mary Symphony Orchestra for their spring concerts in '24 and '25. Mr. Fields is singing with the Virginia Chorale this season, who will join Opera in Williamsburg for their production of Gluck's Orfeo ed Euridice in early November at the Kimball Theatre. Mr. Fields is a soloist for Colonial Williamsburg's Grand Illumination at the Capitol, and for their July 4th Independence Day Celebration at the Governor's Palace. In Williamsburg, Phaedra worked for Sea World Entertainment where she cast and rehearsed the singers for all mainstage shows. Currently, she is the Music Director at St. Martin's Episcopal Church and Professor of Music and Theatre at William & Mary.

Ted Cornell, concert pianist: Ted began his studies at the world-renowned Juilliard School in New York City at the age of eight with a full scholarship and subsequently earned both the Bachelor and Master of Science Degrees. He has been honored by being selected to appear in the awards volume of "Outstanding Young Men of America." He is a concert pianist and organist, has recorded six albums, and has in publication several choral arrangements and two volumes of concert piano transcriptions. 
